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We have had a great term and we would like to wish our lovely Nursery children all the best for Reception and beyond!




Reception

Moxon's Magpies and Evan's Emperors



This term, we've been exploring the changing seasons, with a special focus on how to stay safe in the summer sun. The children have really enjoyed getting involved in seasonal activities, including water play and cooling off with ice pops - perfect treats for these warm, sunny days!



In Maths, the children have been developing their spatial awareness by creating their own farmyard scenes. Working collaboratively in small groups, they used a range of materials to design and build their layouts. Throughout the activity, the children confidently used prepositional language to describe the positions of different animals and objects



Our outdoor area turned into a bubble wonderland! With a splash of washing-up liquid and a swirl of water, we whipped up the perfect potion for **giant bubbles**. Using big hoops, we made bubbles so huge, some of them could fit a whole child inside!

The children loved their hip hop session with Phil. The energetic and engaging lesson not only helped develop their coordination and rhythm but also boosted their confidence. It was a fun and memorable way to stay active while learning new dance moves.

Year One

Sharps' Starfish and Scuffham's Swans and Osborne's Owls



This half term Year One have been learning about plants. To kick start our learning each child planted their own sunflower seed! The children have cared for their plants and tracked its growth over the half term.

Year One have been impressing us with their numbers to 100 this half term. They have explored numbers practically and loved completing a number line challenge! Children were tasked to find missing numbers and work in teams to complete different numberlines.



We had a fantastic trip to Flamingo Land.

We saw so many different animals and some children and adults even held a cockroach and touched a live snake! The children were so well behaved and an absolute credit to our school.



Year Two

We have enjoyed lots of exciting Science lessons this half term. We have been learning about how animals are adapted to live in their habitats. We went into our outdoor area to search for worms and looked closely to identify if the worm had a saddle. We have also learned about habitats of penguins and elephants, as well as camouflaged creatures!



We had a super trip to Filey beach! The children had fun paddling in the sea, building sandcastles and eating ice cream at the seaside. We also had a visit to the lifeboat station and learned about how quickly they can get their lifeboat onto the water. The ice cream lady and lifeboat tour guide commented on how excellent our manners were!



We have had lots of fun learning about our History Topic – *What did the Victorians do for fun?*

We have learned about lots of the different leisure activities that they enjoyed in their spare time and we have compared those to what we enjoy doing for fun today. We have linked our topic learning to the Filey seaside visit and had great fun using inkpens and ink wells to create *Filey Beach* signposts.





Year Three

Sowden's Stoats and Wood's Woodpeckers



In History this half term Year 3 have been doing an in-depth study of Ancient Egypt. To hook them into the topic the children did a reconstruction of the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. They had to crawl through escaping the poisonous gases to see what artefacts they could discover. Then using the artefacts, they had to work out what this tells us about the Pharaoh and civilisation.

In RE this half term Year 3 have been looking at what makes a good leader and leaders from different religions. To finish the unit, they researched in pairs a modern-day leader of their choice. They then had to stand up and present their findings including what the leader had achieved and what qualities make them a good leader. They presented so clearly and used some great oracy skills.



This half term, Year 3 have been learning all about light in Science. We really enjoyed going outside and exploring creating shadows with the best source of light – the sun!

Year Four


Gilbert's Glow-worms and Goddard's Goldfinches





This half term, we had our sports week. As part of this, we had a workshop where we learnt how to break dance.




In Art, we have learnt sketching skills and have focused on landscapes. We have analysed the artwork of David Hockney and created our own landscapes.




Year Six

In maths, we have been doing lots of reasoning and problem-solving questions. Some of the questions were really tricky and we've had to work as a team to find an answer. It really helped by using some of the concrete resources to help us visualise the questions.

In science, we have been learning about evolution and inheritance. We did a study on Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution when he noticed variations in finches on his adventure to the Galapagos islands. We used different instruments like tweezers, chopsticks and pegs to act like birds' beak and other things to act as bird food. We had to see which beak was the most effective at picking up each type of food. The most successful one was more likely to go and reproduce offspring.



In French, we have been learning different types of French games and nursery rhymes and comparing them with the ones we know. We learnt the French version of 'two little dickie birds' and made puppets to go with it. We performed the nursery rhyme aloud to our class. Another favourite was playing the game 'Quelle heure est-il, Monsieur. Loup?'. We will let you figure out what that game is!




Out of School Achievements
