# How you can support your child at home

**Reading-** We will be sending out learning related to the sounds that your child is taught each week. Reading books will be collected and changed on **Wednesdays.** We expect that you read with your child **three times per week**. This will really support the phonics teaching that is done in class.

Phonics- It is vital that your child develops good listening skills in preparation for phonics. Games like Simon says and copy my rhythm are brilliant for this! We have started Phase 2 phonics, which teaches your child how to read and write individual letter sounds. Phonics Play (www.phonicsplay.co.uk) is a great website with games for your child to play. Please choose either Phase 1 or Phase 2.

**Writing-** The first aspect of writing is assigning meaning to marks. Your child will then begin to write initial sounds of words (e.g. d for dog). Please encourage your child to practice writing their name and any new letters that they learn using the correct letter formation. Your child could help you to write a shopping list, cards, notes too!

## How you can support your child at home

**Maths**- We will be counting and representing numbers to 5 in different ways. Your child will gain a deep understanding of numbers 1-5 including one more and one less of each number. Try to encourage your child to count out quantities to 5 and beyond. This could be done through everyday activities e.g. counting how many forks you have, how many teddies, how many steps. Encouraging your child to recognise and write numerals to 5 and beyond would be fantastic.

**Physical Development-** Fine motor skills involve movements using small muscles in our hands and fingers. Gross Motor Skills involve movements in large muscles such as legs, arms and torso.

Fine Motor Skills It's important that your child develops their fine motor skills before beginning to write. This can be done through activities such as playdough, using tweezers, fastening buttons, threading, using lego etc.

**Gross Motor Skills-** Encourage your child to use cutlery when eating meals. Practice hopping, galloping, jumping when you're out and about. Have a go at throwing and catching balls in the garden. Your child can even help you to brush up! (this is brilliant to strengthen their muscles ready for writing).

### <u>Seesaw</u>

We will send updates about your child's learning via Seesaw. We would love you to send us photographs too so we can share these with the class. Please speak to a member of staff if you are unable to access your child's account.

#### Secret Reader

We would love to invite our parents into school as much as possible! If you would like to be a Secret Reader and visit our class to read a story, please let your child's class teacher know.
