We have had a great first half-term in Year 4.

Autumn Term 2025

Gilbert's Glow-Worms (4G-W) will be taught by Miss Gilbert every day except alternate Mondays where they will have Mrs Bishop. Goddard's Goldfinches (4G) will be taught by Miss Goddard every day except alternate Mondays and Wednesday afternoons where they will have Mrs Godrich.

The school gates open at 8:40am and register will be taken at 8:50am.

Children are expected to wear the correct school uniform, including black shoes or black trainers, a white polo shirt, school sweatshirt and grey skirt/trousers. Children can wear a plain, stud earring if they wish. Hairbands should be plain and no other jewellery should be worn.

At Home

Reading is vitally important at home, so please can you continue to read with your child at least three times per week, which is in line with our school reading policy. Please comment in their reading record book and return the book to school so they can be checked. If your child is reading long, chapter books then the record book can be completed each time they read a chapter. Please can your child's reading record be in their bag everyday so staff can access these if needed.

We are planning lots of exciting reading activities this year and hope to promote a real love of reading in Year 4.

In Year 4 the children must do an online times tables test which is statutory in the summer term, therefore supporting your child at home by regularly practicing times tables is vitally important. Times tables knowledge underpins so many other areas of the maths curriculum and so it is vital that all children can recall their times tables and related division facts rapidly. There are lots of options for practising: TT Rockstars, creating a game/chant or quick-fire questions with someone at home.

Your child will be learning spelling techniques and patterns in school. In addition, they will also be learning the common exception words.

What are we learning this half term?

In English, this half term our focus text will be A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens. We will be writing a narrative for this text. We will also be looking at the Mary Poppins by P.L. Travers. We will be developing our vocabulary so we can use ambitious yocabulary when we are writing.

Alongside our English teaching, we will be learning key grammar features from the Year Four curriculum. In reading, we will be using VIPERS, which is a range of reading prompts to develop skills such as using vocabulary, inference and making predictions. We will also be continuing to develop our reading fluency in our reading groups.

In Maths, we are looking at multiplication, division and area. We will also be continuing to work hard on increasing the speed and fluency of our times tables.

In History, we will be learning about the Romans. We will be exploring how the Romans changed Britain.

In Science, we will be learning about teeth.
We will explore why teeth are important
and the digestive system.

Key Texts

Year Four's class novel will be *Mary Poppins* by P.L. Travers and *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens.

Reading scrapbook

As part of developing our love of reading, one child in each class will bring home a reading scrapbook for two days. We ask that this is returned promptly to allow every child to have the opportunity to complete the scrapbook. In this, they will create a scrapbook page to recommend a book they have read to their friends. These will then be shared with the whole class.

PE Days

Our P.E day this half term will be Thursday. Children need to be prepared to be outdoors for PE every week.
