What are we learning this half term?

In **English**, we will writing a nonchronological report about the fossil hunter Mary Anning. We will also be looking at the poem 'In Flanders fields' and writing some war poetry for Remembrance Day.

In **Maths**, we will be continuing with addition and subtraction, using both mental strategies and efficient written methods. Times table practice will continue to be a focus.

In **Science**, we will begin learning about Rocks, Fossils and Soils.

Our **History** focus for this half term is 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. We will be thinking about how much life changed during these time periods, as well as using evidence to help us make deductions about the past. It is also the focus for our school trip to Skelton Grange.

In **Art**, we will be looking at 3D form. The children will learn how to mold and join clay using different techniques so they can make a final piece based on the majestic kingfisher.

Key Texts this half term

We will be reading a few texts to supplement our learning about the Stone Age including 'Stone Age Boy'.

Our class reader is The Stolen Spear by Saviour Pirotta. Hopefully this is a new text for the children so we can enjoy experiencing it together in class.

Leading up to Christmas we will also be reading a version of 'A Christmas carol'.







Things to remember...
