### **Home Learning**

- As well as times tables practise on TT Rockstars, please make sure your child is reading at least 3 times a week.
- Can they talk about what they have read? Here are some prompts we use in school to question their understanding.

**Vocabulary** – Can they figure out the meaning of a new word by reading it within a sentence? **Inference** – Can they pick out the hidden clues about characters or events and figure out what is happening?

**Predict** – Can they make a reasonable prediction about what might happen next, using evidence from the text?

**Explain** – Can they explain what they think, using evidence from the text to justify their opinion?

**Retrieval** – Can they pick out relevant details in order to answer questions?

**Summarise** – Can they summarise what they have read so far, making sure to include the essential information?

Here are some fun activities that your child may like to do at home, they are linked to learning in school. If you do any, please send them into school to share.

## **Spring 1 2025**

In **English**, we will be reading 'Charlie and the chocolate factory' the children will be describing the characters and the narrative.

In Maths, we will be heavily focusing on multiplication and division. First exploring the language of sharing and grouping and using practical methods of division. Then moving onto a more formal written method to calculate. We will be multiplying a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number without, then with, an exchange. The more the children are confident with their times tables the easier they will be able to access the new methods we are learning.

In **Science**, we will be moving onto forces and magnets. This is a great topic and really allows the children to get hands on with their learning to explore new concepts such as friction.

Our **Geography** focus this half term is A European Tour – Where will you go? Within this topic the children will be learning about different European countries and making comparisons with where they live.

In **DT**, we will be focusing on pneumatics. Exploring how air can create movement and using this to create moving monsters at the end of the half term.

# Key Texts this half term

This half term, our key text will be Charlie and the chocolate factory supporting our English topic. We will also be reading a variety of texts that link to our Geography and Science topic. Each class will also choose a text for reading for pleasure at the end of the day.

# Things to remember...

The school gates open at 8:40am and register will be taken at 8:50am. If you are later than 9am, the gates will be closed, and you will need to report to the front office.
