# **The Seven Areas of Learning**

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 interconnected areas of learning and development.

Children should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first. These are:

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND
EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT
COMMUNICATION ANDLANGUAGE
PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning. As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas. These are:

MATHEMATICS
LITERACY
UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD
EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

These 7 areas are used to plan your child's learning and activities. At TNHPS our experienced EYFS teaching team ensure that tasks and challenges are suited to your child's unique needs and interests. Children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking. Our environment indoors and outdoors is continually enhanced with resources designed to scaffold and maximise learning.

# **Reception 2025**

## **Timings of the Day**

School Day- 8:40am to 3:15pm
Lunchtime will be between 12pm and 1pm
In the morning, Reception doors will open at 8:40am to allow for a staggered start to the day. All children must be in Reception by 8:50am as this is when the morning session starts and the school gates close.

Any child arriving after this time will need to sign in at the school office and be marked as late.

#### Lunchtimes

Reception lunchtimes are held in the small hall and are staffed by adults who are familiar to the children.

At lunchtime, the children are able to have a school meal with is provided free of charge under the Universal Free School Meal scheme.

Children may also bring a packed lunch from home.

## **Snack**

Children in Reception can order milk to drink daily and they will be given a piece of fruit each day. Further information on how to order milk will be provided in September. We have a set snack time and all the children are encouraged to try the fruit or snack on offer.

Please send in a named drinks bottle so that your child can have a drink throughout the day.

After each day you must collect your child's water bottle, clean it and bring it back full the following day.

# **School Uniform**

# How can I help at home?



When your child starts primary school there are a number of skills that they should ideally have mastered. Use this sheet as a guide to help track their progress.

#### Self-care

- · I know when to wash my hands
  - · I can wipe my nose
- · I can ask for help if I don't feel well

## Speaking & literacy

- I am interested in reading stories & looking at picture books
- · I am able to talk about myself, my needs & feelings
  - I am practising recognising my name when it's written down

## Getting dressed & undressed on my own

- · I can button & unbutton my clothes
- · I can put my own shoes & socks on
  - · I can put my coat on & use a zip

## Interest in the world & new activities

- I enjoy learning about the world around me
   I am interested in exploring new
  - I am interested in exploring new activities or environments
    - · I like asking questions

## Eating

- · I can use a knife & fork
- · I can open my packed lunch on my own
  - I am confident at opening wrappers & packaging

## Writing skills

- I like tracing patterns & colouring in
- · I enjoy experimenting with different shaped scribbles
  - · I am practising holding a pencil

## Going to the toilet

- I can go to the toilet on my own, wipe myself properly & flush
- . I can wash & dry my hands without any help

## Independence

- I am happy to be away from my mummy, daddy or my main carer
- I am happy to tidy my belongings
   & look after my things
- · I am feeling confident about starting school

## **Listening & understanding**

- · I am able to sit still and listen for a short while
  - · I can follow instructions
  - . I understand the need to follow rules

## Sharing & turn taking

- · I can share toys & take turns
- · I can play games with others
- · I can interact with other children

## Counting skills

- I enjoy practising counting objects
- · I like saying number rhymes & playing counting games
  - I can recognise some numbers when they are written down

## **Routines**

- I have practised putting on my uniform & getting ready to leave on time
  - I have a good bedtime routine so
  - I'm not feeling tired for school
- · I'm learning to eat at the times I will on school days



# How we communicate with you

We provide many opportunities for parents and carers to take an active part in their child's education and find out how your child is getting on. These include:

Seesaw online learning journal
This provides parents/carers with real time access to observations
teachers have taken in class.

Email and Text (any changes of details please inform our school office team)

Parent Consultations - in the Autumn and Spring term, you will be invited to discuss your child's progress. A summary of their development will be discussed with you and how you can support their learning at home.

Throughout the year we also have 'open classrooms', 'stay and plays' and class assemblies; an opportunity to see your child's classroom environment and work they would like to share.

When your child is 5 (At the end of the EYFS) – in the summer term of the reception year in school, teachers complete an assessment which is known as the EYFS Profile. This assessment is carried out by the reception teacher and is based on what they, and other staff caring for your child, have observed over a period of time. A written report will come home towards the end of each term and opportunities are given for you to come in and discuss this with the class teacher.

Throughout your time at TNHPS, you can find information on current learning on our website under Reception class webpage. A weekly Headteacher newsletter will be emailed to you containing school news.
