This half term we have had a huge focus on Maths and using Numicon. We have been problem solving by trying to match the shapes together on the board. The children have also practised recognising the shapes, counting and subitising up to 3. This is brilliant practice and learning ready for Reception!





Following on from our growing topic last half term we have received some great pictures of sunflowers planted in Nursery which are now growing tall at home! These sunflowers are taller than the children! Thank you Lyla, Layla and Eliza-Grace for sending us a Tapestry update.







Our favourite book in Nursery this half term has been "We're going on a Bear Hunt!" We have enjoyed reading and acting out the story so much so we recreated the story using different textured materials. The children loved walking through all the different materials and they told Mrs Lightfoot their favourite was walking through the "splishy, splashy stream!"





Reception had such a fantastic time on their school trip to Eureka. The children took part in a 'senses' workshop and explored the museum so well.

We have been learning about different vehicles including trains, aeroplanes, cars and boats. The children made their own rockets and boats. They even tested to see if they would fly and float!







We have been so lucky to have our outdoor area renovated. The children have loved learning in the provision. Here is a group of children building in the construction area. What a wonderful aeroplane!

Mr Singh visited the Reception classes and taught them all about the Sikh religion. They got to tie turbans, look at some Sikh artefacts and design their own shields.

YEAR ONE

As part of Health Week, we enjoyed a Hip Hop workshop with Phil. He taught us that Hip Hop is a culture and taught us a style of dance called 'break'. It was really interesting seeing his dancing skills and hearing him talk so passionately about the hip hop

culture.



We were very lucky to have children from Year 6 visit Year 2 to teach us some French! The Year 6s had been working hard on





creating games and songs using their French knowledge and we had a wonderful afternoon playing games and learning a new skill.



We had such a fantastic time on our visit to Filey! The children enjoyed paddling in the sea, eating ice cream, playing football on the beach and flying kites. As for the sandcastles – WOW! It was a jam-packed day; the children were a credit to our school and behaved brilliantly.



YEAR TUREE

In art we have focused on the work of Vincent van Gogh. Specifically, his drawings. The children evaluated and critiqued his artwork. They then experimented using different types of lines and media to alter tone and depth. For their final piece they had to recreate a still life image of Templenewsam house in the style of Vincent van Gogh. While inspired by an artist the children created some really unique final pieces with a range of lines and tone used with media of their choice.

This half term we have been exploring light. As part of this we have been finding out how shadows are formed. The children got into small groups to form different shadows using their bodies and came up with some great formations and shapes. From this the children understand light cannot pass through an opaque object.



Girls in Year 3 had the exciting opportunity to experience a new rugby programme aimed at primary school girls. With less and less girls taking up rugby, Leeds Rhinos Foundation have developed 'RugBees' to encourage more girls to get into the sport. Year 3 girls thoroughly enjoyed their session with Ellis.



In science, we have been studying what happens when there is no light source. Children in Year 3 thought our eyes adjusted to the dark but through this exploration, they discovered our eyes adjust to light. They had to try and identify the object in the box, but couldn't. We tried shiny objects as the children thought they would be able to see those. They couldn't! Through this exploration the children realised what true dark really is, and that shiny objects are not a source of light.

year four

In DT, our focus has been on earning how to use cooking utensils safely. Having designed our own pizzas, we then made them, chopping the vegetables and toppings, grating cheese and spreading sauce. Everybody loved their pizzas and they were voted

better than Dominos! Our unit in science this half term has been Living things and their habitats. We looked at different leaves and classified them according to the different characteristics. This work

continued after we had sorted and organised different living things using classification

keys.





We have been learning about the life and work of Claude Monet, who was a French painter and founder of Impressionist painting.

Having learnt different watercolour techniques, such as wax resist and wet on wet splatter, we created our own images of The Japanese Footbridge. Everyone was

very impressed with our paintings and the end results were fabulous.

In music, we have been very lucky to have Mr Duffy for our final term in Year 5. We have continued to master playing the ukulele and chime bars, whilst also learning to read music too. The children have made some excellent progress and we are very proud. Next stop, Leeds Arena?



We were very lucky to have a visit from Alan from the RNLI to talk to us about water safety, and how to keep safe near bodies of water including lakes, resevoirs and the sea! We know what to do in case of an emergency at sea.
