

We had fun making a friendship web: when Suzi Spider's web came your way, you chose someone in the class to thank for something.
















Bun Sale

They learnt how to build dens, make and decorate clay pots and how meals were made a prepared in the stone age. They had an amazing day and it was a fabulous hook for our history topic.







Year 3 have loved having Mr Elvin for their music lessons. They have played tuned percussion and have learnt how to play 'All You Need is Love' by the Beatles. The children have taken this very seriously and have loved the song choice!



Science lessons have been very interesting in Year 3. Looking at the properties of rocks has really captured the children's interest. Once they had explored the rocks and tested them, the children thought of ways the rocks could be used in everyday life, and which rocks would be most suitable for different purposes like roofing, creating statues and making kitchen worktops.






To celebrate Christmas and as part of our official extravaganza, Year 5 and 6 have made Christingles.

Well done to Freya who has passed her British Gymnastics Proficiency Award for Level 3.


